Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease (CMT) is a hereditary (genetic) condition that damages the peripheral nerves. These nerves are responsible for passing on commands from the brain to the muscles in the arms and legs, and for passing information back to the brain about sensation - pain, heat, cold and touch.

Other key points are:

- values the muscles in the legs and arms to waste, which can cause problems with walking, standing and balance and difficulties with hand function and strength
- feet can become deformed, with high arches, curled toes and very weakened ankles
- can cause numbness and poor sensation in the lower legs and arms
- v can cause chronic pain and fatigue
- is slowly progressive, worsening over time
- ⋄ severity differs, even within the same family
- is not curable but can be managed with assistance
- ⋄ affects all ages, genders and ethnic
